· Fabric requirements follow:

o Borders: Listen up! It all depends on what you decide to do. The following measurement is based on the instructions provided. If you decide to add more than 1 border, the measurements will vary. Remember: Betty's quilt top was made up of 3 borders of varying widths. So, if you do more than 1 border, you'll have to do some math. Betty suggests you wait until the quilt top is almost complete before proceeding with your decision on the borders.

o Backing: 5 yards (perhaps more, if you add extra borders).

o Binding: <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard (a bit more if you add extra borders).

· If you are participating:

o You are responsible for providing the fabrics for your quilt {top, backing, batting (unless it will be donated) and binding}.

o Constellation Showcase - tentatively October 2024!

o The quilt will be yours to do with as you please: keep, gift, or donate. Your choice!

o Lastly, the Program Committee reserves the right to tweak the rules!

Summer 2024 BOM (Rail Fence)

· Rail Fence BOM kits were distributed in June. The blocks will be collected, tickets

dispersed, and a winner drawn at the September meeting.

Y2K Charm Pack Challenge

The Block of the Month Committee distributed thirty (30) Y2K Charm Packs. There will be a Viewer's Choice in December.

Additional Rules for Block of the Month Program:

 $\cdot$  For ambitious quilters: if you submit additional blocks, you'll receive an additional entry for each block submitted. For example: Submit 2 blocks this month and you'll receive two entries for the drawing.

· You may transfer all or part of your entries to another guild member.

· If you are unable to make the block, we ask that you return the kit(s) as quickly as

possible so they may be given to the winner of the blocks in a timely manner.

• The drawing will take place during the meeting.

 $\cdot$  It will be up to the members to get their block to the winner. Again, be conscious of the postage and packaging.

"Block of the Month Program 2024 - 2025" Fast Forward:

 $\cdot$  For the winners of the "Block of the Month Program" (July 2024 – June 2025), we will have an additional contest (Viewer's Choice). We ask that the winners of the blocks complete a project, ready to gift, by our January 2026 meeting. The projects will be put on display and Turtle Creek Quilt Guild Members will vote.

 $\cdot$  In addition, if you won a BOM, there are long arm quilters that offer to long arm your BOM Quilt top and ask the following:

o You must supply the backing.

o If the quilt is earmarked for charity, TCQG will provide the batting. Otherwise, you

are responsible for providing the batting.

o If you decide to pursue this, it would be ideal to get your quilt to the long arm quilters

no later than October 2025 Meeting.

o Lastly, follow the steps outlined in "Guidelines for Getting your Quilts Long Armed" below.

Guidelines for Getting Your Quilts Long Armed

If you want a nice job, you must give us a nice top and backing.

· Backing and batting should only be 4" around each side of the quilt top.

 $\cdot$  If the backing is pieced, the seam should be 1/2 to 5/8" and pressed open.

 $\cdot$  Ideally all threads should be trimmed from the front and the back. Most important are the threads on the back since dark threads will show through a light colored top.

• The edges of the backing must be even.

Also, a Thank You to all the members who stepped up over the years to give a program to guild members and to the members who participated in these programs.
